Class Meetings	Capstone meets 1-2 times monthly during a specified period. *Capstone students meet 1:1 with me as needed in a mentorship capacity. Attendance is a PARTICIPATION GRADE.
	 MISSED CLASS MEETINGS: Students are responsible for emailing/texting me BEFORE class if they are going to be absent. Students may make-up a missed class meeting within one week for full credit. Missed classes without prior notification and 1:1 make-up meeting will receive 50% credit.
Capstone Project	Students are responsible for designing a Capstone Project during the course of the year in stages: Brainstorming & Connect, Research & Development, Launch & Learn and Wrap-up & Share. The Capstone Project may be related to career or personal interests, and there is great flexibility in terms of the 'format, structure and implementation' of the project.
Capstone Project EXAMPLES	A monthly podcast; a quarterly TedTalk-style production; research/learn/connect based on an industry or passion; acquiring a new skills set/apprenticeship; community service projects/fundraising/events; designing a new product/idea; <i>The SKY is not a limit - if you can dream it, you can do it~</i>

Deliverables Capstone Project	Students are responsible for documenting 5 hours per week to account for 'seat time,' given the full credit value of the course. ATTENDANCE AND ENGAGEMENT

<u>GRADES:</u> Grades are calculated on a 10% scale: 90% + = A, 89-80% = B, 79-70% = C, 69-60% = D, 59% and below = F. Final grades are based on points accumulated in the following weighted categories:

Life Path Activities	30%
Personal Growth Activities	25%

*Late assignments are subject to 10% point deduction per day late , starting <u>ONE WEEK</u> <u>after the assigned due date</u>. Students can avoid point deductions by communicating with me <u>before</u> due dates and working out a reasonable resolution.

Assignments **not turned in will receive 50% credit per district policy.
