<u>Choose one of the following options to write about</u>. No matter which option you select, remember to include and elaborate on **specific details**. Bring your experience to life by including **sensory details** (sight, sound, smell, taste, and touch), vivid **imagery**, **figurative language**, strong **word choice**, and **emotion**. Show, don't tell.

Option 1: Quarantine Journaling

Write descriptive paragraphs about your experience over the last week. What have you been doing to fill time? How do you feel about quarantine, social distancing, and self-isolation? What are your days like? Explain everything in descriptive journal entries.

Option 2: Think-Yourself-Out Journaling

Feeling trapped? Daydreaming of an escape from quarantine? Think of a place you'd rather be and write descriptive paragraphs to bring that place to life. Where would you go? What does it look like? Why would you go there? What would you do there?

After you've selected which option you are writing about, <u>set a timer for 15</u> minutes and try to write the whole time. <u>Use the loose-leaf paper we have given</u> you in the packet to complete this part of the assignment.

Once your timer goes off, reread what you've written. Mark the descriptive techniques in your writing by lightly coloring words/ phrases according to the following colors:
