

Orchestra notes and enrollment forms have been passed out to interested 4th and 5th graders and classes are forming. Beginner orchestra will be on Wednesday from 2:45 to 4:15. In late September there will be a bus to take students home as part of the ACHIEVE program. Advanced orchestra will be on Tuesdays from 2:30-3:30. All students will attend a lunch recess rehearsal on Tuesdays from 12:05-12:25. Some school instruments are available on a first come first served basis. When they are all in use, students will need to purchase or rent an instrument to use. Concerts will be in Dec. and May at Keeling and on March 10 at 6:30 for the Amphi Orchestra Festival at the High School. 3rd graders are accepted into beginner orchestra if you have an instrument or are able to rent an instrument.

The K-2nd Grade ACHIEVE Early Bird Reading Club will once again be meeting in the mornings before school on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 7:00 to 7:25, in room 122 with Ms. Inbody. This club will start Wednesday, September 2. Ms. Inbody will meet all participants at the front gate at 7:00 to take them to her room. All late arrivals will need to wait till 7:15, when the gate opens, to come to the club. Parents, if arriving after 7:00, please do not leave your child unsupervised.

Monday and Wednesday - Reading Tutoring (grades 1-3)

Monday - Odyssey of the Mind (grades 3-5)

Wednesday - Student Council (grades 4 and 5)

Wednesday - Homework Help (grades 4 and 5)

Monday (and Saturday morning) - Fitness Club for 3rd-5th grade



A 4^{th} grade Math Facts tutoring class will also be held Tuesday mornings before school for students needing extra help.

ACHIEVE is funded by the 21st Century Grant and offers Keeling students the opportunity to receive additional tutoring and/or enrichment outside of their regular school day. Students may enroll in the tutoring and homework help clubs by teacher referral only. Registration information for the enrichment clubs (Student Council, Odyssey of the Mind, and Fitness Club) will be given to those grade level students at school. Space is limited for all clubs so students given a registration form must return it as soon as possible if they are interested in joining the after school club.
